Her sound combines the virtuosic brilliance of bel canto and the expressive intensity of Romantic repertoire, drawing comparisons to singers who unite technical fireworks with emotional sincerity. With Belmont Opera Theater, she has performed both leading and supporting roles, including Olympia in John Davies' Pinocchio and Mrs. Heartfelt in Mozart's The Impresario. Internationally, she earned

recognition at the Orfeo International Music Competition in Vipiteno, Italy, where she was awarded the Orfeo Prize. These experiences highlight her journey from musical theater stages to operatic ones, showcasing versatility and growth as a performer.
